Environmental Society

There was a positive outcome at the February meeting to the continued running of the HES. Idris Thomas was elected Chairman, Bob Griffiths Treasurer and the secretarial roles being shared by Sian Phillips, Margaret Crennal and Kathy Joules.

The nest boxes in the woods at the Gignog were cleaned out and re-erected in mid January whilst those in the Community Woodland were similarly dealt with by the Grasshoppers.

A grant from Keep Wales Tidy enabled us to purchase the materials to construct 9 barn owl nesting boxes. The PCNP invited us to make them at their Cilrhedyn Woodland Centre in late January where as well as assisting us and making us very welcome several members were given a conducted tour of the surrounding woodland by Ian Meopham (PCNP Ranger). Thanks to the kind permission

of local farmers the completed boxes were erected during February on land along the Brandy Brook Valley. These will be monitored and recorded by HES members.

Two mornings have been spent on routine maintenance in the Community Woodland since the last newsletter. Anybody may join in. If you use the woodland please consider coming along to help.

Dr. Sarah Beynon gave a very interesting, informative and entertaining presentation at our April meeting. We were introduced to the work and plans she is carrying out near her farm in St. David's with particular emphasis on the role of dung beetles. It is hoped to have a site visit later in the year.

The next meeting will be on 3rd June at 7.30 in the Community Centre.

Grasshoppers Club

Attendance has dropped off since Christmas with only 3 - 5 coming to some meetings. Colder weather and indoor meeting may have had an effect. There was a good turnout, however, when it came to the field trip to Plumstone Forestry to see the evening arrival of the starlings. This was delayed until early March in the vain hope it would be slightly warmer than last year but there was still a cold wind blowing. The birds performed well as usual and for the keen sighted there were buzzards and sparrow hawks to see plus the possible sighting of a goshawk. The children found tree climbing useful to help keep warm.

At an earlier meeting the nest boxes in the Community Woodland were cleaned out and re-erected. There was great excitement when live wood mice were found in one box – they were left undisturbed and the box returned to its original position.

All the raised vegetable beds have been cleaned out and prepared for the summer with potatoes, onions and carrots already in and awaiting warmth and rain.

All the Grasshoppers and their helpers would like to thank the Community Council for their generous donation to help the club to continue. Club members will have a stall at the Community Fête where the progress of their vegetables can be seen.

Treasurer's Report – 9th April 2015

A steady income is being received from hire of the Centre, totalling £1827.75 for the year ending 31st March 2015. We have again this year provided complimentary hire to the Community Council for the Remembrance service tea and for their Christmas party. The Community Centre is being hired privately for birthday parties. This year we have made a saving of £233.83 for insurance for the Centre by comparing companies. An increase in charges was proposed (effective from 1st May 2015) to help pay for the inflating costs for electricity, consumables, stair lift service, PAT testing, fire safety inspections and the forthcoming cleaning labour costs plus the ongoing cost of the lottery licence and insurance. The following was proposed and unanimously agreed:
Birthday parties £22 for 3 hours (£20) Outside community hire £11 (£10) Community groups hire £7 (£6) NB: the current charges are stated in brackets.
